THE RULE BOOK

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WAY TO INFORMATION



1

Registration:

- Registration will be through Google forms.

Theme:

- Participants will be given a socio-legal theme at 4:20 PM on the 30th of April, 2022, and they will be given 40 min. to submit their answer scripts.

General Rules:

- Mandatory enrolment in a regular program in any recognized Law University /College/Institution.
- Participants will be required to submit a valid student ID proof online, and it will be checked offline on the university campus.
- Participants participating in the RTI Drafting Competition will submit their drafts in the English language only.

- The decision of the panel judges shall be final.
- Pen and paper will be provided to the participants.
- Participants will have to dress in Moot formals.
- Participants will be allotted a registration code which shall be used for further communication, and participants must write the same code on their answer scripts.

Disqualification Criteria:

- On grounds of usage of any electronic device during the competition period will be considered unfair means leading to immediate disqualification.
- On grounds of the participants not adhering to the theme and time limit.
- On grounds of the participants not adhering to the competition's rules and regulations.



INQUIZITIVE

2

Basic requirement:

- A team of two people.

Round 1

- Random questions will be asked to the teams. The first four teams to reach 15 points will qualify for the final round.

Round 2

- Every team starts with 100 points.
- The team that has qualified first in Round 1 will be chosen to start the game.
- The chosen team can choose from anywhere on the board to answer a question from the given six subject categories.
- The questions will be arranged in order of difficulty from top to bottom. The more complex the question, higher the points to be scored.
- If a correct answer is provided, the team is awarded the points. If they fail to answer the question, the question will pass to the next team.

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- In each round, teams can bet their points against their opponent's ability to answer the chosen question correctly.
 - The points leveraged will be added to a betting pool.
 - If the given team answers the question correctly, they get all the points from the betting pool. If not, the answering team will not receive any points. The betting teams will receive back their leveraged points two-fold.
 - There will be no negative marking.
 - The team with the maximum points at the end will be declared the winner.

Registration:

- Registration for the event will take place through Google forms.

Duration:

- Each member will be allotted 10 minutes to read the judgment that will be provided at the venue of the competition.
- The team will be allotted 20 minutes to write the summary of the judgment.

General rules:

- Team shall consist of 2 members.
- Each member will be given a similar judgment.
- Each member will be seated apart in a room; no conversation shall take place once the event starts.

- Usage of electronic device/books will qualify as grounds for immediate disqualification.
- Members will be judged on the basis of similarity of the individual summaries.
- Members have to write only the ratio decidendi of the judgment.
- The participants will be allotted a registration code which shall be used for a further communication, which they have to provide on the answer script.
- The summary shall not exceed 500 words.
- Participants will have to dress in moot formals.
- Pen and paper will be provided to the participants.



UNRULY RULE

4

Registration:

- Registration will be through Google forms.

Theme:

- *UNRULY RULE* are judgments made by one or more judges of a particular court who disagree with the majority opinion and convey their opinions on the case that differ from the majority opinion on the bench. Furthermore, by publishing such dissent, the writer can define his or her position on the subject and the necessity for the distinct viewpoint. Dissent plays a crucial part in judicial decision-making and has the potential to have a significant impact on legal progress. As a result, it is critical to examine the function of dissenting judgments in legal decision-making.

Disqualification criteria:

- Participants who submit later than the scheduled time.
- Participants found violating any rules and regulations while writing their opinions.
- Participants found in possession of or using any Bare Acts, Textbooks, Notes, Mobile Phones, Laptops or any electronic device.

General rules:

A group would consist of maximum two members.

- A sheet with the case name will be shared with the group in the classroom. Five minutes would be provided to read the case sheet. Two students from any University will then present their dissenting judgment, representing advocates from either side.
- Participants are required to write a dissenting opinion of the given case within a span of 45 minutes thereafter.
- The Dissenting judgment should not exceed more than 500 words.
- The participant will be evaluated on the following parameters:-
 - Brief narration of the facts of the case along with the judgment.
 - Reference to relevant precedents and other sources
 - Representation of case with footnoting and citation style
 - Highlighting of potential flaws in majority's reasoning.
- The participants are to be dressed in Moot Court Formals.



LEGALLY CREATIVE



Duration of the competition:

- The participants will have 35 minutes to complete the poster.

Theme:

- Participants are to make a poster/meme/creative on the circulated theme.
- Themes will be circulated at the beginning of the competition.
- The theme must be the focus of the participant while making the poster.
- The poster must not represent any individual, organization, brand name, nation and must not depict any religious theme, sexual innuendo or be seditious in nature directly or indirectly, even if it is related to the theme of the competition.
- Participants are free to present their poster/meme/creative on paper and even digitally on a computer.

Disqualification criteria:

- Submitting the said creative later than the time.
- Participants that do not adhere to the theme they choose.
- Participants found in violation of rules and regulations as mentioned.
- Participants found using any electronic device when the event is taking place.
- Participants that make a digital poster on any other platform other than Canva (it is a graphic design and editing software used to create PPTs, posters, documents and other visual content.) will be disqualified.

Drawing tools:

- The organizing committee will take care of the essential drawing tools, viz. drawing sheets (A3 size), crayons, pencils, etc.
- The participants are allowed to carry their own stationery as well.

Scoring criteria:

- Relevance to the theme
- Originality and creativity.
- In accordance with the given instructions (must clearly mention the name and course/college on the back of the poster in the English language)

(The rest of the criteria will be based on the discretion of the judges)

General rules:

- Each participant can submit only one poster/meme/creative.
- The poster/meme/creative can be made by hand or in a digital form on Canva.
- A poster/meme/creative should be the original and individual effort of the Participant.
- Any poster/meme/creative submitted for the competition shall become the property of the organizing team.
- The poster must be an original work of the participant.
- The decision taken by the judges and the organizing team will be considered as final.



SOCIAL WALK

About the Competition

Lead your walk with what concerns you the most. Let society know the social issues that concerns you the most by way of dressing, slogans, quotes etc. Join the walk with other students raising their respective concerns in this Social Walk. Come together on this forum to present your views on issues which concerns you the most and let others get aware about such issues through platform provided by us.

Eligibility

Undergraduate students pursuing Three/Five-year LL.B degree course from recognized Law College/ University in India, subject to fulfilment of the registration procedure.

Team Composition

Each team shall consist of minimum one member for a maximum of five members.

Official Language:

The official language of the event shall be English/Hindi.

Structure of the Competition:

- Judging Criteria:

The teams would be evaluated on the following parameters: -

- Evocation- How well they are able to convey their points and intent for their cause.
- Presentation- The way in which their cause is represented by them through make up dressing etc.
- Creativity- The ability to grab the attention of the public with out of the box thinking.

- Participant Requirements/Conduct:

- The participants are required to come dressed up in their own costumes if any or they can use cut-outs, placards, and posters.
- Conduct of participants during the event is limited to slogans, phrases and cue calls for no longer than 3 minutes per group.
- The enactment of skits and plays is prohibited, the candidates found to be in violation of this will be immediately disqualified for the same.



CLIENT COUNSELLING



About the Competition:

- Client Counselling Competition stimulates a mock law-office consultation, where law students, acting as lawyers, are presented with client matters. It promotes greater interest in law and helps inculcate soft skills which encourage law students to interview and build lawyer-client relationships.
- The School of Law takes immense pride in providing this platform to law students to hone these skills and become better legal practitioners.

Date of the Competition:

- The preliminary rounds would be held on 30th April 2022. The final rounds would take place on the 1st of May 2022.

Eligibility:

- Undergraduate students pursuing Three/Five-year LL. B degree course from a recognized Law College/ University in India, subject to fulfilment of the registration procedure.

Team Composition:

- Each team shall consist of only Two members.
- There can be a maximum of Two teams representing one college/university.

Official Language:

- The official language of the Competition will be English.

Competition Topic:

The subject matter of the competition is restricted to Law of Contracts, Law of Torts, Motor Vehicles Act, Consumer Law, Criminal Law, and Personal Law. All consultations will be based on the aforementioned topics.

Rounds:

- 1.The Competition shall consist a preliminary round, following which two teams with the highest score shall qualify for the final round.
- 2.The winner of the final round will be based on the higher score among the two.

Structure of the Competition:

Each round shall be divided into two segments, i.e.

- a. Client- consultation session
- b. Post- consultation session.

Client-consultation Session:-

- The team is expected to elicit information from the client, outline the dispute, analyze the issues involved and propose solutions to resolve the disputes. The teams have the liberty to decide how they would want to approach the work. Both participants are expected to contribute to the consultation process as a team.

Post Consultation Session:-

- Each team is expected to conduct a post-consultation discussion amongst themselves after the client leaves the room.

Note:-

- The participants are expected to speak loud enough to be audible to the judges.
- The clients would be trained students of Bennett University.

Time Limit:

A. Preliminary Round

- Each team shall have a maximum of 20 minutes to complete the session.
- The time allocated to each segment is as follows:
 - 10 minutes - consultation session with the client,

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- 5 minutes - post-consultation session and,
 - 5 minutes - Judge's question-answer round.

B. Final Round

- Each team will have a maximum of 25 minutes to complete the session.
- The time allocated to each segment is as follows:
 - 15 minutes - consultation session with the client,
 - 5 minutes - post-consultation session and,
 - 5 minutes - Judge's question-answer round.

Judging Criteria:

The teams would be evaluated on the following parameters: -

- Establishing a professional working relationship and atmosphere.
- Effectively obtaining information from the client.
- Understanding client's perspectives on their problems.
- Appreciating the client's goals, expectations, and needs.
- Exploring the available options and considering their respective consequences.
- Identifying legal and non-legal problems.
- Developing legal strategies to address the concerns of the client
- Team Co-ordination.
- Recognizing and dealing with ethical and moral issues .

Dress Code:

- The participants are expected to wear Business Formals for all the rounds of the Competition.

LAW TREASURE HUNT



Basic requirement:

"Only requires a team of four; the rest of the event has no boundaries"

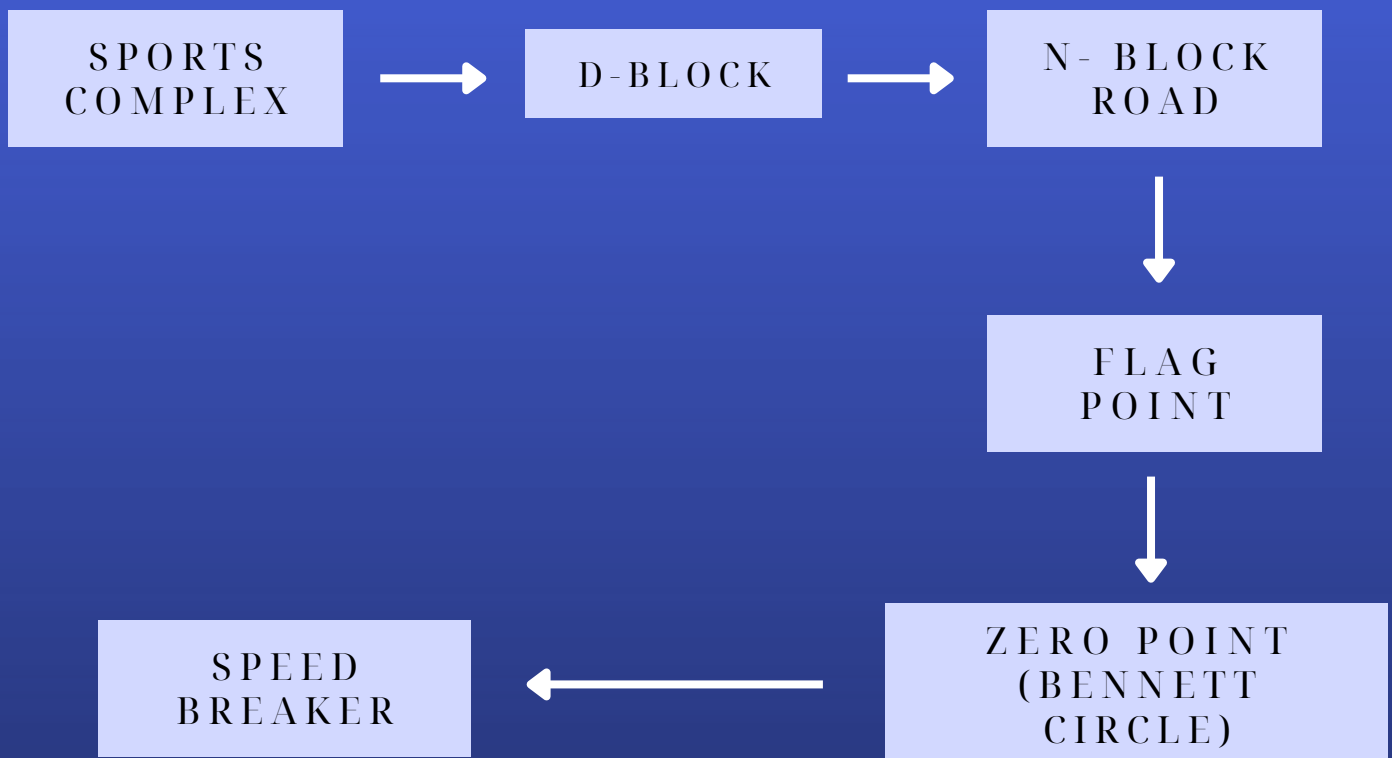
Basic Knowledge regarding treasure hunt:

In the treasure hunt, participants work in small teams to find the treasure with the help of given clues. The team who decodes the clue and finds the treasure first will win the game. The game of treasure hunt comes from the concept of scavenger hunting, where participants have to find the number of items from the list provided to them. Treasure hunt differentiates itself from scavenger hunting by providing clues to find the treasure. In this digital era, treasure hunt games are organized online with the use of websites and social media handles. The first Internet scavenger hunt was organized by Rick Gates in 1992. Since the school of law, Bennett University, is organizing its 3rd edition of the law fest, the entire event will be based on legal stuff. The entire event would be for two days, which are as follows :-

Day 1:-

- The team would comprise of two people from different universities and colleges.
- The race would start from the sports complex and end at Speed Breakers (besides the behind A block), as mentioned in the picture.

RUNNING AREA DURING 1ST DAY TASK



Day 1 - Knock out Round - 1 Hour 30 Mins

- Participants would be offered or given certain things through which they would have to interpret and decide the law book category and the desired circumstance comes within. Participant has to brisk walk from the sports complex to D block.

- Participants have to carry those hefty legal books in the polybag from D BLOCK to N Block Road and run as fast as possible. If the polybag tears while running, they have to return to the D block and restart the run.
- When the participants reach the N Block road, they will be given balloons. The contestants must tap the balloon and sprint as fast as possible to the flag point while holding their legal books inside the polybag.
- From flag point, Participants will keep their Polybags and Books, and then at that point they will get a slip or a chit in which a poetic judgment would be given which when decoded right, will be allowed to run till the Zero point.
- From Zero Point, the Participant's hands would be tied with a rope, and they would have to eat Hot and spicy samosa upon consumption Participant will be provided a tie with which the Participant has to run till the finishing point while knotting the tie. The selected or qualified Participant will qualify for Day 2 Race.

Day 2 – 2 Hours

- The Day two race is on the lines of the Student of the Year Treasure hunt competition, but through a law student's outlook.
- Two participants will be paired and receive a situation, which they have to analyze situation and reach to the said specific spot.
- When the Participants reach the spot, they have to analyze the situation by the evidence which would be hidden anywhere in the entire campus.

- The clues or evidence would be given to the participants in a poetic way, similar to the student of the year movie, and when participants get all the respective evidence or clues and have connected the dots or linked the clues in such a manner that the evidence would aid you in the investigation of the case.
- In the last step, the Participants will interact with vetted people from whom the Participant has to analyze who the main accused could be in the given crime scene.

If a Participant does decode the same, he/she will be declared the winner of this mega treasure hunt competition.



GROOVE 'N' GLAM



Dance Competition:

- Only five entry per Institution is allowed.
- Maximum 10 participants allowed per team while minimum is 1.
- The team may consist of all boys, all girls or a mixture of both.
- The number of accompanists permissible is 2.
- There is no bar on the type of dance.
- Duration of dance should not be more than 5 minutes.
- The participating team will be responsible for removal of their sets, properties etc. immediately after the completion of their performance.
- Judgment will be based on the basis of Rhythm, Formation, Expression, Costumes, Make-up, Sets on Overall Effect.
- Time for sets/instruments setting is maximum 2 minutes.

Singing Competition:

- Only five entries per Institution is allowed.
- Time for Stage/Instruments setting is maximum 2 minutes. The number of accompanists would not be more than 2.
- Duration of the performance must be between 4 to 5 minutes.
- Judgment will be made on the qualities like, composition, rhythm, coordination and general impression.
- The performance may be solo, duo or group.
